February 19, 2019 Tuesday 7-9pm **Wildfire Trends in SW Oregon with Bill Kuhn**, Southwest Oregon Area Ecologist for the US Forest Service. What's driving these trends? Bill will cover past, current & projected future trends.

June 5, 2019 Wednesday 9am-Noon. Fuels Reduction Tour hosted by JJSWA member Bill Potterf. See the results of a fuels reduction project using a "slash buster."
